## GOLD PLAN (STUDENTS BEGINNING IN/PRIOR TO FALL 2022)

For students who began at Emory (or Oxford College) in or prior to Fall 2022, there is no change to their overall GER plan. We will refer to their plan as the GOLD plan. (GOLD is old. The BLUE plan is the new GER.)

As we transition courses to the new GER and change course tags to reflect the new system, students will encounter both sets of tags in Course Atlas. Only current students can use both sets of tags shown below (as they fulfill their required Gold GERs) for each area.

## BLUE PLAN (STUDENTS BEGINNING IN/AFTER TO FALL 2023)

Students who begin at Emory (or Oxford College) in or later than Fall 2023 will undertake the full new GER plan. We will refer to their plan as the BLUE plan (BLUE is new).

The new GER is broken into five categories with various course requirements that are timed as milestones on the journey to degree.

## **Appendix A: Natural Science Course List for Current Students**

Students who are completing the GOLD GER Plan are required to complete two Science, Nature, Technology (SNT) courses. One of these courses must include a laboratory component (SNTL).

As we transition our GER Plan, SNT and SNTL courses may now carry the new NS (Natural Science) tag. While all NS courses will satisfy the SNT (no lab) requirement, they do not all satisfy the SNTL requirement.

Students may complete their SNTL requirement via any course which retains the SNTL tag or a course from the list below which has received an updated NS tag:

- **Anthropology**: ANT 201
- **Biology**: BIOL120 + 120L, BIOL141 + 141L, BIOL142 + 142L
- Chemistry: CHEM125, CHEM150 + 150L, CHEM202 + 202L, CHEM202Z + 202ZL
  CHEM 203 + 203L
- Environmental Sciences: ENVS 222, ENVS 229, ENVS 230, ENVS 232
- Neuroscience and Behavioral Biology: NBB 120
- Physics: PHYS 116 + 116L, PHYS 131, PHYS 141 + 141L, PHYS 142 + 142L,
  PHYS 151 + 151L, PHYS 152 + 152L, PHYS 253 + 253L
