

Res Hall Support Structure

Complex Director (CD)

Full-time, master's-level professional living on campus. Supervises student staff, supports residents, and serves as a resource for families.

Resident Advisor (RA)

Trained juniors/seniors who live on each floor. Plans programs and supports students.

Sophomore Assistant (SA)

Trained sophomores who mentor first-year students in the halls.

Residential Programming

Key Card Access

All-You-Care-To-Eat Dining

Meal swipes provide entry into the all-you–care-to-eat Dobbs Common Table (DCT) in the Emory Student Center.

- One swipe = one entry to the DCT
 - Meal exchange available at Cox Hall, Clairmont Café, White Hall, Woodruff Residential and Nom Station
- First-year students on Meal Plan A receive 16 guest swipes per semester
- The DCT is open 7 days per week:

Monday-Thursday: 7:30 a.m. - 10 p.m.

Friday: 7:30 a.m. – 8 p.m.

Saturday: 10 a.m. – 8 p.m.





Mail and Packages

- The Emory Mail Services process should be followed for all mail and packages shipped through major carriers Amazon, FedEx, UPS, USPS, DHL.
- Please refrain from shipping high value items such as iPhones, tablets and laptops. If you must do so, please insure the package.
- All items ordered from same-day delivery vendors (Instacart, Doordash, UberEats, etc) should be delivered directly to your location address and you should arrange clear delivery instructions when ordering.

Have your packages shipped to Storage Squad and your items placed in your room *before* you arrive on campus.





Move-In Process





Before you leave home:

- Print your Emory move-in placard (in Emory Welcome app)
- Label all your belongings.
- Double check your move-in timeslot in MyHousing Portal
- Review Move-in info in Emory Welcome App.



Arrive on campus:

Use the provided address in the Emory Welcome App to route to the unloading area of your residence hall. Display placard on windshield. Pull up your vehicle and volunteers will help unload your belongings.



NOTE: Move-in process will look different for those moving in on days other than Monday, August 18 or Saturday, August 23.

Move-In Process





Check In:

Volunteers will direct you to a check-in table where students will need to show a photo ID. Students will then receive their EmoryCard and room key.



Relocate your vehicle:

After your vehicle is unloaded, you will be asked to relocate your vehicle to either Peavine Parking Deck (29 Eagle Row) or Fishburne Parking Deck (1672 N. Decatur Rd).
